Travis Bornstein will share his personal story about the loss of his son Tyler to heroin. Tyler was an athlete in Stark County, and by the time he was eighteen, Tyler had undergone two major surgeries on his right elbow. After each surgery, he was sent home with prescription medication to help manage the pain. Innocently, before he knew it, Tyler was addicted to opiates and eventually heroin. Despite trips to rehab, Tyler died at age 23.

Tyler's parents, Shelly and Travis, founded Hope United two years later to bring awareness and support to families struggling with addiction. Join us at Hoover Hall October 25th to hear about their son's life and death and their mission to help others learn about drug addiction.
