STRASBURG MIDDLE SCHOOL PBIS PROGRAM

Dear Parent/Guardian.

Included in this folder is information about our 6th grade PBIS program. This program will be a continuation of what your child was a part of in elementary school with a few changes/modifications to the program. Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a proactive approach to establishing the social culture and behavioral supports needed for all students in our school to achieve social, emotional, and academic success. Our PBIS program has four core expectations that can be used at school, at home, and in the community. We refer to these as "The Tiger Pledge."

Tigers pledge to be respectful, responsible, Safe, and Prepared.

Students are expected to honor these core expectations in various school and school-related settings, including classrooms, hallways, media center, cafeteria, bathrooms, buses, and all other school grounds.

Below is a description of the items found in this folder:

<u>Daily Report Card</u> - A parent/guardian will be expected to sign this Daily Report Card (DRC) each night. Failure to do so will result in your child losing his/her paw print for the day.

<u>Tiger Pawsitive Behavior Party Schedule</u> - At the midpoint and end of each nine week grading period, students who have lost fewer than 3 paw prints will be invited to a Tiger Pawsitive Behavior Party. The dates for those parties are listed on this sheet.

<u>Tiger Shout Out Cards</u> - These cards will be used to recognize students positive behaviors and actions.

<u>Monthly Drawing Dates for Lunch with the Principal</u> - Each month, one Tiger Shout Out Card will be drawn from each homeroom basket. The individual's name on that card will then be provided lunch from one of our local restaurants by Mr. Hall.

<u>Tiger Pawsitive Behavior Expectations</u> - This sheet explains behavior expectations for all students at various locations and venues in the district.

Expected Behaviors - All students in the Strasburg-Franklin Local School District are expected to adhere to these behaviors.

<u>Tiger Pledge</u> - This sheet lists the four core expectations of our PBIS program.
